## Some Key Issues In Need of Our Advocacy Support

**A. Withdraw U.S. troops and bases from Iraq. Close Guantanamo. End policies that allow torture, mistreatment, and extraordinary rendition of prisoners.**

**B. Increase U.S. poverty-related development assistance to 1% of the federal budget.** This would do more for U.S. and global security than most of what our military budget supports.

**C. Move immediately to stimulate the economy. Ensure that relief plans reach ordinary people especially those at risk with their mortgages, health care, employment, retirement and college savings...**

**D. Address the conflict in Gaza with a commitment to support genuine security and justice for both Israelis and Palestinians.** Use nonviolent means to confront conflict elsewhere in the world.

**E. Encourage emerging powers to renounce nuclear weapons** and to join nonproliferation efforts. Lead the way with significant reductions in the U.S. nuclear arsenal, deployment, and budget.

**F. Place active nonviolence at the center of our public policies.** Not the empty stereotype of passivity or weakness, but the creativity and power of the movements that took Nelson Mandela of South Africa from prison to President in a half dozen years... pulled down the Berlin Wall and 12 Eastern European governments... sent the Philippines' ruthless dictator into exile... and are central to efforts in the U.S. for civil rights, peace, gender justice, the environment, etc.
